February 2014 Update from Northfield Ward Police Safer Neighbourhoods Team (SNT)

As part of our commitment to strengthening community links your local police team hold public meetings and conduct regular surveys of residents.

These surveys and meetings help to set future policing priorities in the ward. There is more about the current priorities and local ward promises below.

Your kind assistance and participation in this scheme is much appreciated and will help us set the ward's policing activities for the next three months.

Current Priorities and Promises

Safer Neighbourhoods Teams (SNTs) are now obliged to set three ward promises that address local community issues for which police are capable of providing a response without the need for long-term activity or requiring little, if any, partnership working.

As well as having three ward promises, the Neighbourhood (Ealing Neighbourhood consists of all 7 Wards; Walpole, Elthorne, Ealing Broadway, Ealing Common, Northfield, Hobbayne, Cleveland) will also set three priorities. These will be set by the Cluster Inspector to meet the main police/community demands and needs of all the wards within that Neighbourhood. As neighbourhood priorities will focus on more long term problem solving issues across the neighbourhood, the ward promises are designed to ensure that local concerns, which may not be addressed by the neighbourhood priorities, still receive a police response.

Your participation in completing this survey will therefore greatly assist us in deciding the three ward promises, which will be finalised and reviewed at the ward panel meetings. The ward panel meetings, which are held every two-three months, are made up of representatives from the local community and your SNT.

The current three neighbourhood priorities are:-

1. Residential Burglary
2. Theft from person
3. Operation Hawk - Drug search warrants

The current three ward promises are: -

1. Increase patrols in the locality around our primary schools to counter inconsiderate parking by parents to which adversely affect our local residents.
2. Licensing visits to Off licenses on South Ealing Road, Northfield Avenue and Boston Manor Parade, to reinforce their knowledge of their duty not to serve under age and drunken customers.
3. Increased patrols in Blondin Park to reassure residents and alleviate ASB.

However, depending on the results of the survey and consultation at the ward panel meeting, three promises will be selected and fulfilled by your SNT. If you wish to add any comments regarding the promises or would like your SNT to address other local concerns, not mentioned below, please fill out the 'comments' box.

Suggested Local Ward Promises

- Street drinking South Ealing Road and Boston Parade - Robust policing by patrols during which a zero tolerance approach will be taken towards street drinking. Alcohol seizures will be employed and dispersal action will be used where appropriate
- Carry out visits to local primary schools to provide road & personal safety advice
- Counter low level ASB by young children in shops on South Ealing Road and Northfield Avenue especially after school

- Increased patrols in Blondin Park to reassure residents and alleviate ASB
- Licensing visits to Off licences on South Ealing Road and Northfield Avenue to reinforce their knowledge of their duty not to serve under age and drunken customers
- Increase patrols in the locality around our primary schools to counter inconsiderate parking by parents which adversely affect our local residents
- Increase police availability by holding drop-in surgeries at the Northfield SNT base once a week
- Carry out visits to elderly residents or elderly resident groups to provide crime prevention advice particularly around distraction burglaries and fraud
